3. Health and nutrition surveillance systems strengthened, changes monitored, early warnings heeded, and immediate life-saving actions taken through outbreak response and technically sound nutrition interventions			
4. Preventable ill health - particularly communicable and vaccine-preventable diseases controlled

<p>6. Access to basic, good quality preventive and curative care including essential drugs and vaccines for all ensured with special focus on the especially vulnerable - the elderly, the very young, pregnant women, the disabled and the chronically ill.</p>			
<p>7. Humanitarian Health Assistance in line with international standards and local priorities for public health and not compromising future health development</p>			
<p>8. Secure humanitarian access, and neutrality and protection of health workers, services and structures guaranteed, as integral parts of public health promotion</p>			
<p>9. Record of health-relevant processes and activities maintained, so to ensure that the lessons learnt in a crisis are used to improve health sector preparedness for future crises and disaster reduction.</p>			
<p>10. Relief efforts linked with national/local capacity building so to set the ground for integrated health policies for preparedness, emergency response and post –conflict rehabilitation and greater resilience of the health sector.</p>
