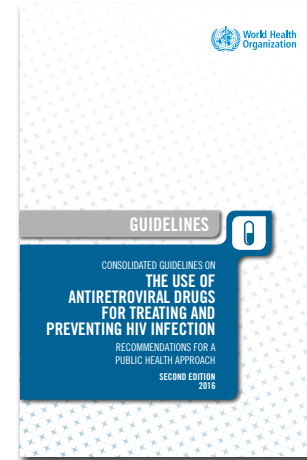

WHO'S TREAT ALL POLICY: WHERE ARE WE, WHERE DO WE NEED TO GO AND WHAT DOES IT TAKE?

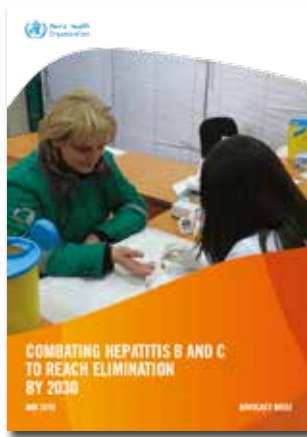

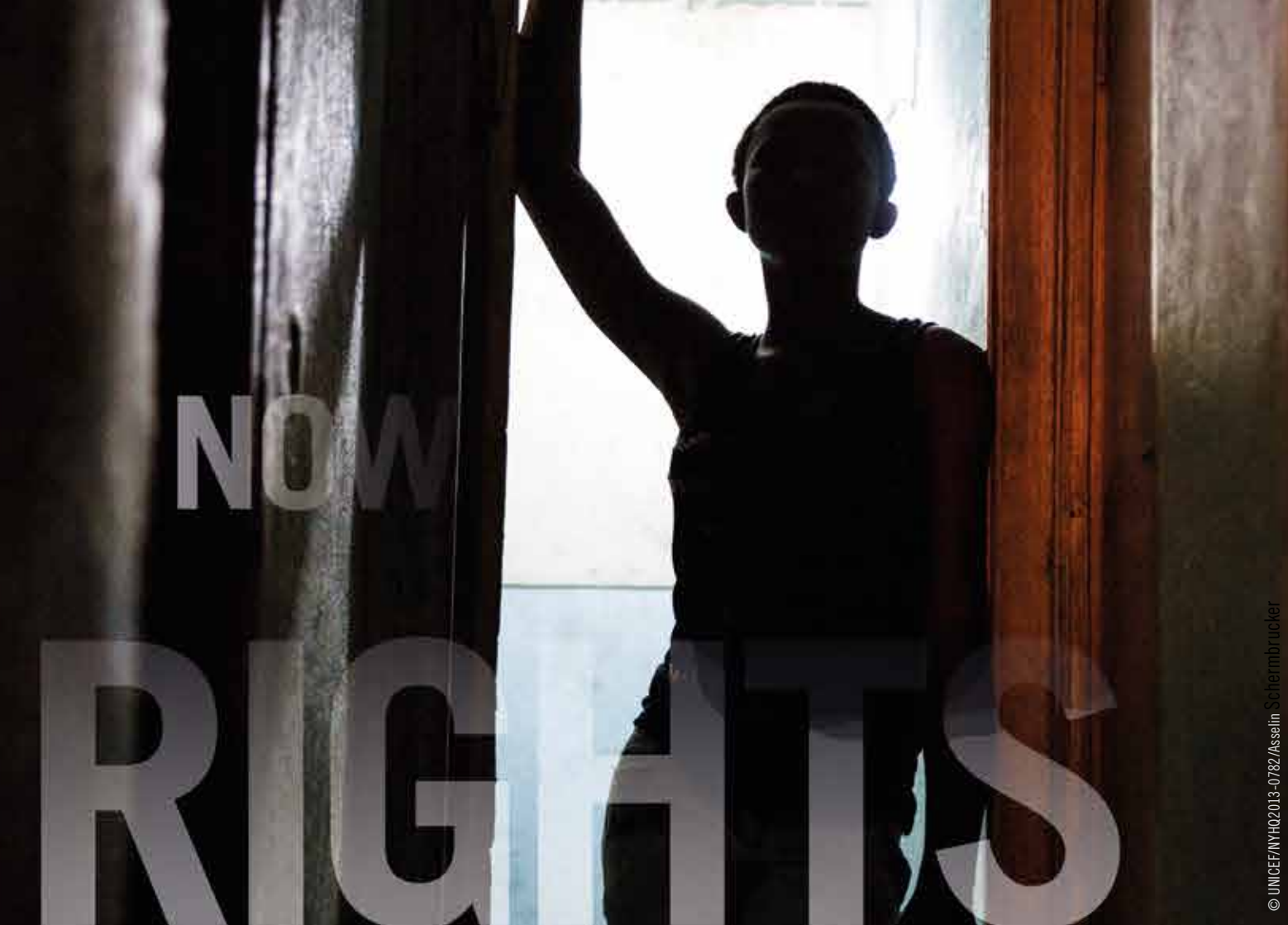
