Member States

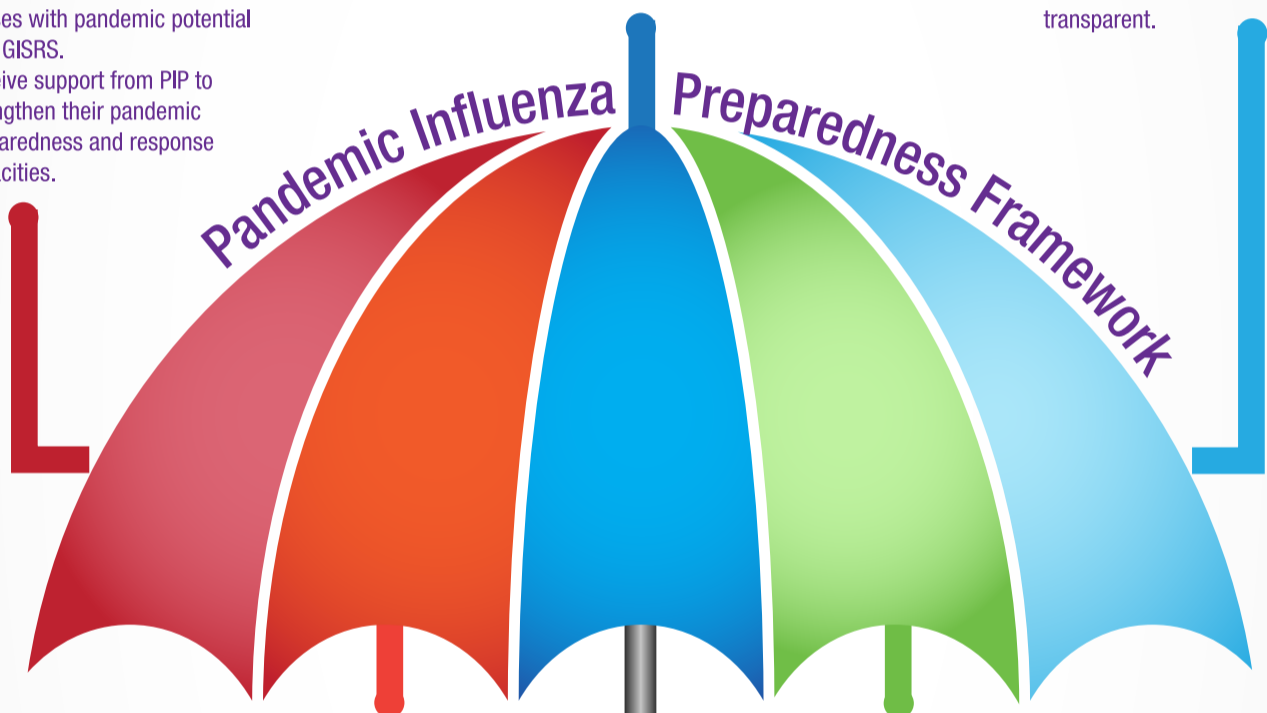
- Ensure that national laboratories share influenza viruses with pandemic potential with GISRS.
- Receive support from PIP to strengthen their pandemic preparedness and response capacities.

WHO

- Uses funds provided by industry to help countries prepare for the next influenza pandemic.
- Signs agreements with manufacturers **now** to have equitable access to vaccines and other response products **later**, when they are needed.

Civil Society

- Providing guidance and advice to WHO and the PIP Advisory Group to make sure implementation of the PIP Framework is fair and transparent.



WHO GISRS Laboratories

- International network of specialized influenza laboratories that do year-round surveillance of influenza, assess pandemic risk, and develop vaccine viruses for industry to make vaccines.
- GISRS is coordinated by WHO.

Industry

- Produce influenza-related products, such as vaccines, antiviral medicines and diagnostic tools.
- Pay an annual contribution to WHO for use of GISRS materials and information.
- Sign advance donation or reserve agreements with WHO for response products.
