



Qatar

GENERAL INFORMATION

Qatar is a country with an approximate area of 11 thousand square kilometers (UNO, 2008). The population is 1,508,322 and the sex ratio (men per hundred women) is 311 (UNO, 2009). The proportion of the population under the age of 18 years is 15% and the proportion above age 60 is 1% (UNO, 2009). The literacy rate is 99% for men and for women (UN Statistics, 2008). The life expectancy at birth is 78 years for males and 77 years for females (UNO, 2005-2010). The healthy life expectancy at birth is 68 years for males and 77 years for females (UNPD, 2010). The country is in the high income group (based on 2010 World Bank criteria). The total expenditure on health as a percentage of gross domestic product is 2.46% and the per capita government expenditure on health (PPP int. \$) is \$866.0 (WHO, 2006). Suicide rate information is not available. In Qatar, neuropsychiatric disorders are estimated to contribute to 20.8% of the global burden of disease (WHO, 2008).

GOVERNANCE

An officially approved mental health policy exists and was approved, or most recently revised, in 2011. Mental health is also specifically mentioned in the general health policy.

A mental health plan exists and was approved or most recently revised in 2010. The mental health plan components include:

- Funding allocation for the implementation of half or more of the items in the mental health plan.
- Shift of services and resources from mental hospitals to community mental health facilities.
- Integration of mental health services into primary care.

Dedicated mental health legislation does not exist. However, legal provisions concerning mental health are covered in other laws (e.g., welfare, disability, general health legislation etc.).

Note: A National Mental Health Plan has recently (as of 2010) been approved by the Supreme Council of Health in Qatar. However, the timeline for implementation has not been finalized yet. A draft Mental Health Act was also submitted, and is being reviewed.

FINANCING

Mental health expenditures by the government health department/ministry are not available.

Note: Mental hospital expenditures (by the Hamad Medical Corporation (HMC), the primary public Health provider in Qatar) represent 1.95% of the total health budget. This figure only applies to the public sector and excludes primary care services.

MENTAL HEALTH CARE DELIVERY

Primary Care

Prescription regulations authorize primary health care doctors to prescribe and/or to continue prescription of psychotherapeutic medicines. In contrast, the department of health does not authorize primary health care nurses to prescribe and/or to continue prescription of psychotherapeutic medicines. Similarly, official

policy does not permit primary health care nurses to independently diagnose and treat mental disorders within the primary care system.

The majority of primary health care doctors and nurses have not received official in-service training on mental health within the last five years. Officially approved manuals on the management and treatment of mental disorders are not available in the majority of primary health care clinics. Official referral procedures for referring persons from primary care to secondary/tertiary care exist. However, referral procedures from tertiary/secondary to primary care do not exist .
