Conference Overview

Millions of workers in developed and underdeveloped countries are exposed to crystalline silica. Adverse effects associated with exposure to silica dust remains an occupational health issue in many countries around the world. Characterization of silicosis risk at occupational settings with silica dust exposure using improved and standardized methods of exposure assessment is needed. At the same time, the role of silica in the causation of lung cancer is an ongoing concern. This workshop will provide a forum for researchers and practitioners in occupational health and environmental sciences to exchange new knowledge, methods, and research strategies for research or control of silica dust exposures and disease prevention.

The past workshops in this series were held in Wuhan in 1998 and 2001. This third workshop promises to expand on the success of the past two meetings, providing a forum for discussion of research needs, strategies, and opportunities for effective international collaborations on topics of (1) Environmental Dust Monitoring Methods and Comparison; (2) Physical and Chemical Characteristics of Silica Dust; (3) Epidemiological Perspectives on Silica Dust Hazards; (4) Biomarkers of Silica Dust-induced Lung Cancer and Silicosis.

The Workshop will be held immediately before the Tenth International Conference on Occupational Respiratory Diseases (organized by International Labour Office ILO, and Ministry of Health of China) on April 19-22, Beijing, China.
