MINISTERIAL DECLARATION

- ✓ Ministers will sign a high-level Declaration containing bold commitments by countries to accelerate action to end TB.
- ✓ This will inform the first UN General Assembly High Level Meeting on TB in 2018.

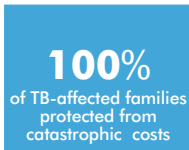
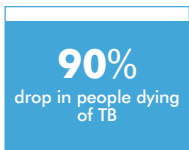
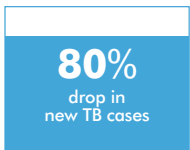
