Weekly Situation Update

12 - 19 October 2020

Highlights

- This week we saw a spike in the requests for cargo movement registered in the WFP Emergency Service Marketplace (ESM);
 179 tickets were submitted, more than double than the previous three weeks. This increase comes after the deadlines for the free-to-user cargo services has been confirmed.
- WFP will deliver all cargo currently booked in the ESM as well as what is registered in the <u>Supply Portal</u>, additional service requests are accepted until 31 October, as long as these are for cargo ready to be moved by 30 November. WFP envisage that the last deliveries could be completed by the end of the year.

Consortia Updates



Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- 80 million PPE items are currently under preparation or in transit.
- 254 million items have been delivered.
- 71% of the delivered items are masks, followed by examination gloves.



Diagnostics

- 18.5 million manual PCR tests have been delivered and 391 thousand are ready to ship or in transit.
- 4.88 million sample collection kits have been delivered and 81 thousand are ready to ship or in transit.



Biomedical equipment

- 15.7 thousand units of oxygen concentrators are ready to ship or in transit.
- Additional requests for transport are being submitted into the ESM for 22.600 oxygen concentrators and 37 ventilators.

Figures include volumes secured through the consortia, as well as quantities purchased and allocated directly by the supplying agencies.




