




Situation summary in Mongolia

- 12,461 cases and 60 deaths were newly confirmed in the past week.
- 6,882 new cases were confirmed in UB and 5,579 cases were confirmed in 19 provinces of total 21 in the past seven days.
- Two provinces of the country have haven't reported new cases within the past seven days
- 13,022 close contacts have been identified and 9,662 (74.2%) family, 124 (1.0%) workplaces, 385 (3.0%) relatives, 46 (0.4%) from friends, 49 (0.4%) from same apartments and ger districts, 3 (0.02%) from same gatherings, 25 (0.2%) from others. There were also 2,728 unlinked close contacts.
- HCWs infection is 2.0% (2701 cases) of all of the reported confirmed cases. 104 (33.2%) of 314 new cases in the past week is community acquired infections.
- 60 soums of 7 aimags (provinces) started movement restrictions and/or entry restrictions by the decisions of the local administrative offices.
- Peoples interprovincial holiday movements have been intensified due to 9 days official holidays.
- Ministry of health announced that 80-95% of circulating SARS-CoV2 viruses are Alpha variant in a study; and 5 of 50 samples that were sent to Japan were sequenced as Delta variants.



Epidemic curve of local cases of COVID-19, confirmed date





Immunization

- The vaccination in this week has been increased by 20.0% compared to the last week.
- As of 9 July 2021, 1st dose coverage was 82.9%, and 2nd dose coverage was 76.1% in the target population.
- 1st dose of vaccination for the children between 12-17 is temporarily suspended do to the supply issues. 2nd dose coverage has been going normally.
- 30,420 doses Comernaty (Pfizer-BioNTech) vaccines were imported by charter flights.

Health care services

• There are cumulatively 11,000 beds deployed to treat COVID-19 patients and 6400 of them are in Ulaanbaatar, 4600 of them in provinces.

NPI measurements

- About 60 soums in 7 aimags are closed PoEs to contain their local transmission. Citizens are encouraged to check social media accounts of different government departments of provinces regarding requirements at PoEs. Some provinces still maintain the mobility restrictions except in the event of funeral, health emergency, official mission, food transportation.
- MoH, GASI, Civil Aviation Authority of Mongolia, NCCD, City Health Department, health specialists
 convened panel discussion virtually on prevention of transmission of SARS-CoV-2 virus, namely
 Delta. Resolved from the virtual meeting is proposition of isolating those returning from overseas
 fro the duration of 14 days regardless of their vaccination or immune status. The proposal shall be
 discussed at the irregular cabinet meeting of the Government.

Planning and information

 National surveillance and response guidelines are revised including contact tracing, reporting, screening, triage procedures and indicators for surveillance, contact tracing and health care capacity respectively.

Risk communication

- National surveillance and response guidelines are revised including contact tracing, reporting, screening, triage procedures and indicators for surveillance, contact tracing and health care capacity respectively.
- From July 5 to July 11, 2021, a total of 15,136 calls were received through the Call pro program in 119 emergency advising phone service; and 11,977 calls were received from the 1st level through the Bitrix program, and each call was successfully resolved. The total number of calls decreased by 8,178 compared to the previous week.

Logistics

- NCCD has started to review the local disease situation on a weekly basis, issue a report and provide
 recommendations to the provinces. In addition, professional and methodological advice and
 assistance is provided by telephone from time to time, and professional teams are working in some
 the provinces.
- Within the private and public partnership framework, MoH is procuring PCR kits for MNT 28k each (old price MNT 55k), Remdezivir IV agent for MNT 50k (old price MNT 149,600) each from the suppliers of medicines, diagnostics and medical equipment and thanked them for their social responsibility, trust-based nonprofit deeds in overcoming the pandemic. While quality of the products is priority, cost effective approach enables to improve accessibility to more Covid testing and treatment, claimed the Minister of Health.
- USA based Gobi Fund NGO donated 60 oxygen concentrators, 60 oxygen and pulse meters for the country.
