This Situation Report is jointly issued by PNG National Department of Health and World Health Organization once weekly. This Report is not comprehensive and covers information received as of reporting date.

Situation Summary and Highlights

- ☐ As of 26 July, Papua New Guinea has a total of 62 COVID-19 cases. There were 46 new cases detected from 19 to 26 July.
 ☐ The NCD Provincial Health Authority is leading case.
- ☐ The NCD Provincial Health Authority is leading case investigation and contact tracing with support from the National Control Centre (NCC) and WHO.
- ☐ Health care worker risk assessments are ongoing. From the hospital-based cases, several health care workers have been found to be at high risk for infection due to exposure and lack of appropriate PPE.
- ☐ Surge capacity planning is ongoing. In Port Moresby, the Taurama Aquatic Center and Bisini Grounds have been assessed to possibly accommodate mild to moderate case in order to de-

to possibly accommodate mild to moderate case in order to designate the Rita Flynn Facility for severe cases. PNG has already requested international Emergency Medical Teams through WHO.

Prime Minister Hon James Marape launched the Niupela Pasin (New Way) on 17 July. A Niupela Pasin Cluster is being set up at the NCC to effectively roll out the Niupela Pasin guidance and ensure that establishments and communities put hygiene and social distancing measures in place.

□ New National Pandemic Measures were announced by the Controller and Deputy Controller on 23 July. An additional measure was issued on 24 July regarding the mandatory wearing of face masks or face coverings in public places which shall be implemented starting on 29 July.

From 17 to 23 July, the average national daily COVID-19 surveillance reporting rate has slightly dropped compared with previous week from 60% to 54%.

Upcoming Events and Priorities

- **Coordination:** COVID-19 Response Plans for the National Coordination Centre (NCC) and Provincial Coordination Centres will be put in place as mandated by the National Pandemic Act 2020. The previous National Response Plans prepared by the National Department of Health and the provincial plans written by Provincial Health Authorities shall be reviewed and can be used as bases for the revised/new plans. A meeting is now being arranged between the Prime Minister and Provincial Health Authority CEOs to improve coordination and ramp up provincial preparedness activities.
- **Surveillance and Testing**: Testing is expanded with the implementation of an enhanced testing strategy. Community-based testing is now being discussed with stakeholders and community leaders as part of the expanded testing and active case finding strategy. Support for community testing, quarantine and isolation is now being explored with non-government organizations and development partners in preparation for a surge in cases in the National Capital District. Currently, contact tracing is priority. The NCD Provincial Health Authority is leading case investigation and contact tracing with support from the NCC and WHO. WHO is also supporting health care worker risk assessments. From the hospital-based cases, a total of 22 health care workers so far have been found to be at high risk for infection due to exposure and lack of appropriate PPE.
- **Quarantine**: Additional resources are required to improve monitoring of persons in quarantine, facility assessments and instituting home quarantine.
- **Case Management:** All confirmed COVID-19 patients are to be isolated at the 79-bed Rita Flynn Facility regardless of severity. Provisions for case management are being put in place to ensure capacity for appropriate care and treatment. Surge plan for an additional 200-bed facility using nearby sports facilities had been approved and shall be activated in the next few weeks.
- Infection Prevention and Control: With the recent approval of the National IPC Policy and Guidelines, printing and distribution to health facilities are being planned. The National IPC Technical Working Group shall meet and regular working discussions with the IPC focal points throughout the provinces shall be established. IPC measures in health facilities need to be improved.

• Risk Communication & Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (NPIs): Political and community leaders are continuously being engaged. Media, including social media, are being used to encourage behaviour change in hygiene practice, symptoms monitoring, staying at home when feeling unwell and reporting to the national hotline. With the recent launch of the Niupela Pasin (New Way), a new cluster is being set up at the National Control Centre to effectively roll out the Niupela Pasin guidance and ensure that establishments and communities put hygiene and social distancing measures in place.

National Transmission Assessment

3 – Large-scale community transmission

As cases continue to increase rapidly in Papua New Guinea, majority of cases cannot be easily linked to a source of infection. Currently, about 35% of the cases have an epidemiological link established. As nearly all new cases have been reported from the National Capital District, community transmission in NCD is indicated. However, confidence in the representativeness of the collected samples is low and larger scale transmission cannot be ruled out in NCD. Testing in other provinces remains critically low, therefore ongoing transmission in other parts of the country is a possibility as population mobility continues. Importation from bordering Papua Province in Indonesia and incoming travellers from other countries reporting COVID-19 cases also remains a threat.

Epidemiology

- Papua Province in Indonesia is continuously reporting COVID-19 cases in areas that border Sandaun and Western Provinces in Papua New Guinea. While the border is officially closed, the threat of case importation from Indonesia remains high.
- As of 25 July, Papua Province has reported a total of 2817 confirmed cases and 32 deaths (data accessible at https://covid19.papua.go.id/).

Strategic Approach

National and Provincial Public Health Response

- The Pandemic Response Coordination Group, comprised of teams representing health operations, provincial health liaison, investigations and support (Royal PNG Constabulary), border security (PNG Defence Force), State Solicitor (legal), public information, planning and coordination, procurement and logistics, and finance, meets daily at the NCC.
- The Pandemic Response Measures issued on 16 July were revoked on 22 July for implementation starting on 23 July. New measures were introduced in the Domestic Travel Measures (No. 3) and Business and Social Measures (No.9). Additional measure on the mandatory wearing of face masks or face coverings in Port Moresby was issued on 24 July for implementation starting on 29 July. Details of the new measures are presented in Annex A.

Surveillance

- For the period of 18 to 24 July, the COVID-19 National Hotline received 1663 calls. Of the only 85 (5%) health-related calls, 54 (3.2%) were referred to the Rapid Response Team. To date, the Hotline received 78 961 calls.
- Surveillance updates are disseminated daily to provinces by the Surveillance and Epi Team of the National Control Centre.
- Most of the provinces submit daily reports of suspected COVID-19 (including SARI) patients. While completeness of
 reporting is increasing, sample collection and testing are still not adequate to generate reliable transmission assessment.
- From 17 to 23 July, the average national daily COVID-19 surveillance reporting rate remained at 60%. Three provinces (i.e. Eastern Highlands, Morobe and Madang) recorded 100% reporting rate. In comparison, three provinces (i.e. Hela, Autonomous Region of Bougainville and Enga) had 86% reporting rate for the week. Two provinces (i.e. Western Highlands and New Ireland) did not submit any reports during the same week.




Figure 1. Daily COVID-19 Surveillance Reporting by Province from 17 to 23 July 2020

COVID-19 Prevention, Detection and Control

- Domestic Travel Measures (Pandemic Measure No. 3) outline valid reasons for travel to and from Port Moresby, which include: (1) students returning to their usual place of residence or returning to their educational institutions; (2) persons returning to their usual residence; (3) essential services; (4) seeking medical assistance and medical evacuation; (5) emergency transport, including but not limited to repatriation of deceased persons. The same measure also states that all airlines are required to implement ICAO take off guidelines.
- Business and Social Measures (Pandemic Measure No. 9) ordered: (1) closure of nightclubs; (2) hand hygiene and other hygiene measures are to be practised at venues or part of venues that operate for the sale and consumption of alcohol; and, (3) PNG Sports Foundation to ensure that all sports spectators wear masks or face coverings.
- Pandemic Measure No. 10 ordered wearing of masks or face coverings in enclosed spaces within establishments, aircrafts and designated markets.
- For the recent cases detected, NCD Provincial Health Authority is leading case investigation and contact tracing with support from the National Control Centre (NCC) and WHO. Health care worker risk assessments are ongoing. From the hospital-based cases, a total of 22 health care workers have been found to be high risk for infection due to exposure and lack of appropriate PPE.
- As of date, there are two cases admitted at the ICU of Port Moresby General Hospital. While one is on ventilator, both are stable. At Rita Flynn Facility, there are 27 cases admitted who are all stable.
- Given the recent cluster of cases, Port Moresby General Hospital announced scaling down of its services that affected pathology services, surgical services, consultation clinic and all other essential services. Pathology services will maintain urgent tests, including cross matching and blood transfusion services. All elective surgical cases are on hold indefinitely while emergency surgeries will continue to be provided in both general and specialty surgical operations, and obstetrics and gynaecology emergency services. Starting on 20 July, the consultation clinic reduced to seeing no more than 15 patients per clinic. The hospital management directed other essential and specialty services to adopt and maintain new normal practices. It is a priority to support the national referral hospital and other major hospitals in Port Moresby to remain operational.
- St. John's Ambulance has supported NDoH and NCD PHA in COVID-19 response with ambulance service to respond to, manage and transport persons suspected or confirmed with COVID-19. Since March, their Incident Management Team Structure has been in place to provide: (1) logistical and technical assistance to the National Control Centre and NDOH; (2) awareness on COVID-19 with 10 minute presentations using loud hailers in markets, public places, schools, and government institutions; (3) warehouse management of medical supplies and PPE for NCD PHA and Port Moresby General Hospital in partnership with UNICEF and WHO; (4) continued ambulance services for COVID-19 suspected and confirmed cases; (7) medical care for persons in quarantine by dispatching a nurse, HEO or medical officer for clinical care to persons in quarantine who develop medical problems not related to COVID-19 with out-of-pocket payment from the users; (8) assisting NCD PHA in surveillance and contact tracing; and (9) support in preparation to pilot a drive-through testing centre in Port Moresby.
- NDoH and WHO have partnered with the Australian Government (DFAT), John Staff and Burnet Institute in launching an
 essential online training program for healthcare workers in PNG for COVID-19. The training contains practical resources
 and scenarios that are tailored to the needs of the country, especially for both clinical and administrative staff. See Annex
 B for the details.

Communication, Community Engagement and Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (Social Measures) — NIUPELA PASIN

- Niupela Pasin (New Way) was launched by Prime Minister Hon James Marape on 17 July. It is a collection of information
 products that communicate the new normal of healthy behaviours for: individuals, families and communities; places of
 worship; health facilities; businesses, markets and shops; workplaces, banks and pharmacies; transportation; and,
 National Control Centre and other responders.
- To promote testing and address stigma against it, a short information video is currently being developed to emphasize the importance of testing for COVID-19 and describe the country's testing strategy. It will show a simulation of the testing process at health facilities to allay fears and anxieties around swabbing.
- Famous rappers in PNG, Cammy Bee and Sprigga Mek, produced COVID-19 awareness song ("Wok Bung Wantaim") in partnership with NDoH and DFID/UKAid. The song is a mixture of English and Tok Pisin, and advocates for Niupela Pasin, including hygiene and sanitation practices as part of the country's COVID-19 response.
- With the support from the World Bank, UNICEF's project sets the 4-minute song video for 116 spots for primetime airing on FM100, Hot 97 FM, TVWAN and EMTV from 17 July to 16 August. The radio and TV stations take up to 95% of the listenership and viewership throughout the country.
- Prime Minister Hon James Marape emphasized on 24 July that: (1) schools will continue to operate with prevention measures; (2) there will be no lockdown of Port Moresby, instead the city will be divided into different zones and enforcement of public health measures would commence with the deployment of military, police and public health professionals; and (3) responsibility of individuals to families, communities and the country to practice prevention measures, including wearing face masks at all times in public places, washing hands with soap and water, maintaining physical distancing, sneezing into own elbow, and not touching the face, eyes and nose.
- NDoH and WHO held a meeting with the church leaders, Sir John Cardinal Ribat (Chairman of the Council of Churches) and Rev. Roger Joseph (Secretary-General of the Council of Churches) to discuss the rolling out of Niupela Pasin in churches and to gather support from churches in raising awareness on COVID-19.
- On 24 July, the Office of the Archbishop of the Catholic Archdiocese of Port Moresby announced adopting Niupela Pasin
 to remind people to stay safe and care for one another in response to COVID-19 in their churches. Some examples of
 the measures include reducing the number of people who come into contact by celebrating Mass with no more than 100
 people, emptying the Holy Water at the entrance of the church, practising physical distancing, washing hands with soap
 or using sanitizer, and wearing masks in public.

Logistics and Supplies

- WHO encourages partners to utilize the COVID-19 Supply Portal accessible at https://covid-19-response.org/. The Portal is a purpose-built tool to facilitate requests for critical supplies by national authorities and partners. The requests are assigned to purchasing agencies that can execute the order and process it, utilizing existing ordering systems.
- UNICEF handed over to Acting Secretary for Health Dr Paison Dakulala over 631 000 items of PPE on 25 July. The
 procurement was supported by the Governments of PNG, Australia and Japan and Newcrest Mining Ltd. Earlier, on 23
 July, UNICEF delivered more than 100 000 units of PPE, including gloves, surgical masks, goggles, face shields, gowns,
 coveralls and thermometers to Port Moresby General Hospital.

Funding and Expenditure

- Below is a summary of COVID-19 funding and expenditure by fund source as of 24 July. The table below pertains only
 to funds that were held and transacted through the NDOH Health Services Improvement Program (HSIP) Trust Account,
 thus not comprehensive to cover all COVID-19 support made available to the country and provinces through other
 modalities (e.g., funding through UN Agencies, etc.).
- Total funds received from the Government of Papua New Guinea (GoPNG) 2020 Warrants is PGK 45.3 million. PGK 2.0 million was allocated to NCC activities. Expenditure to date is PGK 38.3 million (PGK 36.8 million for main activities and PGK 1.5 million for NCC activities). Outstanding commitments stand at PGK 6.8 million. Thus, the available funds out of the GoPNG Funds is PGK 160 822.
- A total of PGK 4.4 million allocated to 22 PHAs was transferred to the provinces via HSIP Subsidiary/Provincial Trust Accounts. Based on expenditure reports received, 97% of GoPNG funds in PHAs have been expended/committed.
- Funds received from New Zealand Aid amounts to PGK 6.29 million. PGK 5.99 million was transferred to the provinces while PGK 308 800 remain in the parent account for monitoring activities.
- Under the HSIP Trust Account, the total available funds from all sources is PGK 4 363 276.

Best Practice/Lessons Learned

Response Enabling Factors and Adjustments to the Response

- The Epi/Surveillance Pillar continues to generate essential data that informs national leadership for decision making.
- Continuous engagement and coordination with various stakeholders and development partners result to identification of areas of pandemic response where support is required. Partners consistently support procurement of PPE, medical and laboratory supplies to prepare for, detect and respond to the outbreak of COVID-19 in the country. Non-government organizations are also willing to support in community testing, home quarantine and isolation.
- The National Control Centre, in considering implementation of community-based testing, is engaging community leaders to earn the trust of their respective communities, support crafting appropriate messaging to explain and encourage testing, and ensure safety of healthcare workers should they be deployed to collect samples in the communities.
- Recognising the limitations of the health system, the country takes on a proactive approach in securing additional support. The country has made a call for the assistance of international EMTs as surge capacity where is required.
- Provincial profiles are regularly updated based on the responses of provincial authorities to the Provincial Preparedness
 Checklist. Additional sources of information include the records of assessment for medical and non-medical equipment,
 laboratory diagnostics, health workforce and financial resources from stakeholders and partners. These are helpful in
 priority actions to address the identified challenges and difficulties experienced by the provinces.

ANNEX C – COVID-19 Enhanced Testing Strategy for Health Facilities in PNG

COVID-19 Testing

Collect nasopharyngeal swabs from at least 10 patients daily in each health facility (provincial and district hospitals, urban clinics and private clinics) who present and with any of the below criteria:

Test ALL PATIENTS presenting at health facilities meeting the COVID-19 case definition.

COVID-19 suspected cases

- Collect nasopharyngeal swab specimen for COVID-19 testing from all persons that fit the COVID-19 case definition.
- Collect nasopharyngeal swab specimen for COVID-19 testing from all persons presenting with pneumonia (inpatient or outpatient) or serve acute respiratory illness (SARI).

Test SOME PATIENTS each day presenting with the following:

Influenza-Like Illness

• Collect nasopharyngeal swab specimen for COVID-19 testing from persons presenting with Influenza-like Illness (only a few each day per health facility, and no more than 10 per facility).

Simple cough

• Collect nasopharyngeal swab specimen for COVID-19 testing from persons presenting with simple cough (only a few each day per health facility, and no more than 10 per facility).

Post-mortem specimen collection from a patient who had respiratory illness before death

For a death in which the patient had respiratory illness and a specimen was not collected before death, collect the following postmortem specimen:

- Collect post-mortem Nasopharyngeal Swab specimen for COVID-19 testing as soon as possible.
- Specimen can be collected up to 3 days after death as virus may still be detected; however, sensitivity
 may be reduced with a longer post-mortem interval

Testing of confirmed cases for discharge from isolation

No test required for discharge

Criteria for discharging patients from isolation (i.e. discontinuing transmission-based precautions) without requiring retesting:

- For symptomatic patients: 10 days after symptom onset, plus at least 3 additional days without symptoms (including without fever and without respiratory symptoms)
- For asymptomatic cases: 10 days after positive test for SARS-CoV-2

COVID-19 test reporting

- For every sample collected for COVID-19 testing, a COVID-19 Case Investigation Form (CIF) must be completed.
- Based on the presentation of the individual being tested, indicate on the CIF the reason for testing.
- Notify the Provincial Health Authority (PHA) Surveillance Team of any COVID-19 suspected case and notify the PDCO/DDCO immediately for pick-up of collected specimens or need for rapid response team (RRT) response.
- The PHA surveillance team will deliver/ship samples to CPHL/IMR.
- It is recommended that PHA have an inventory of UTM and PPE distribution to avoid stock out. A health
 facility must notify the PHA Surveillance Team in advance of a stock out of UTMs, CIFs or contact linelists.
- If there is a case in which a clinician has high clinical suspicion of COVID-19, write "FOR URGENT TESTING" on the top of the CIF and notify the PDCO, CPHL and the National Surveillance Team.

- Reporting is only done in Danu for ILI/SARI. According to Kiunga team Lead, pretriage has not reported any ILI /SARI therefore not reported. Teams were advised to report POIs from Indonesia or the PNG citizens crossing the border.

Challenges


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- Team Klunga indicated a reduction in human resources engaged in RRT and quarantine due to non-payments.
- Daru Quarantine tents were pulled down. The agreement was for 3 months and now the 3 months is up, they were advised to pull the tents down.
- Apart from COVID-19 preparedness and response. Kiunga team indicated challenges with medical supplies, with orders from 2019 still pending. What was received weeks ago was from 2014 orders which are now outdated.
- Oxygen supply to Kiunga Hospital is not available. This has caused the hospital to scale down on operation. Contractors have delays in delivering the oxygen supply.
- Expenditure is still slow due to change of signatures. So far, the only fund expended was the K200,000 given for surveillance, training and risk communication.
