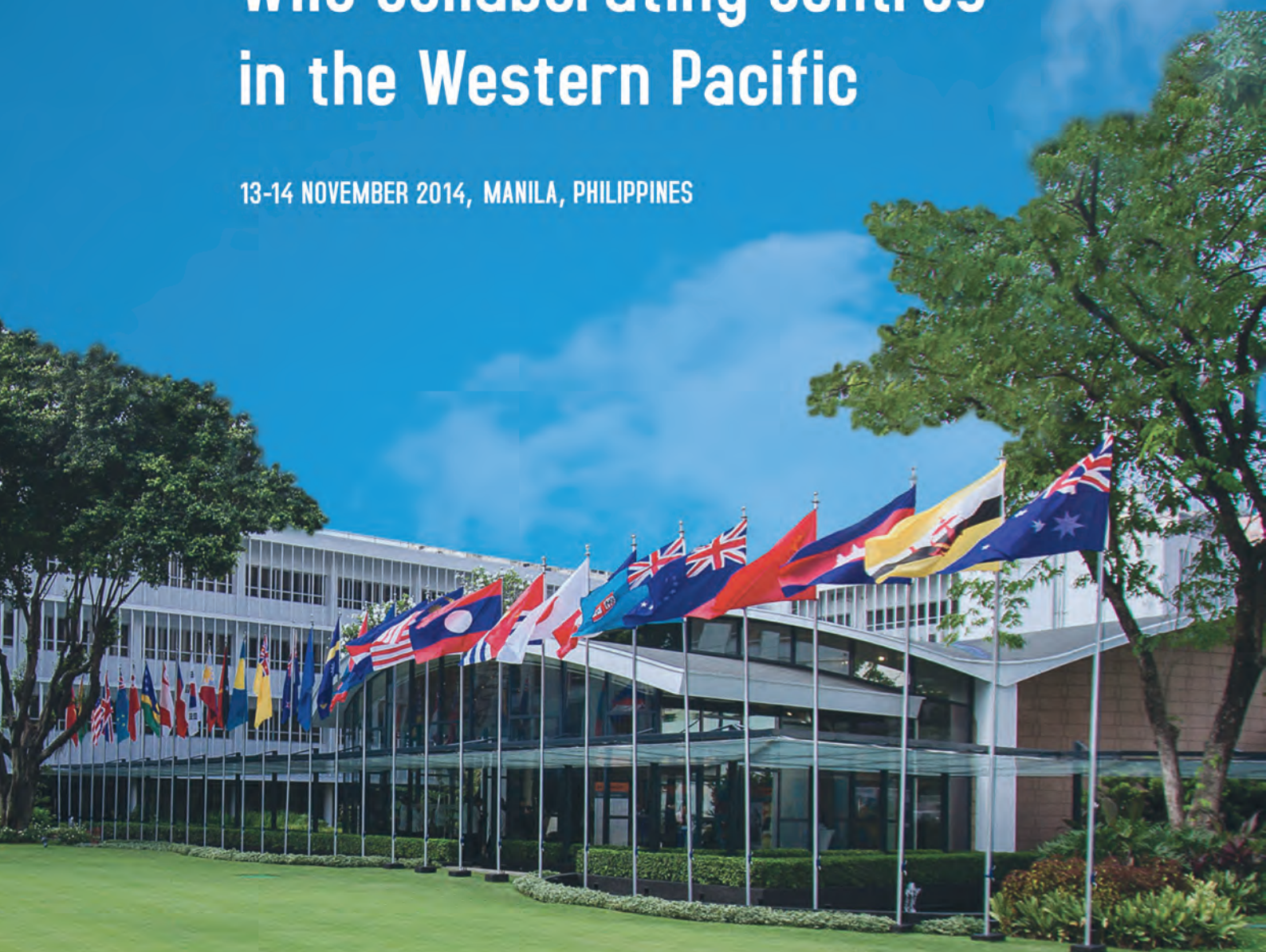

Lunch time seminars: Overview on Policies and procedures of WHO Collaborating Centres system

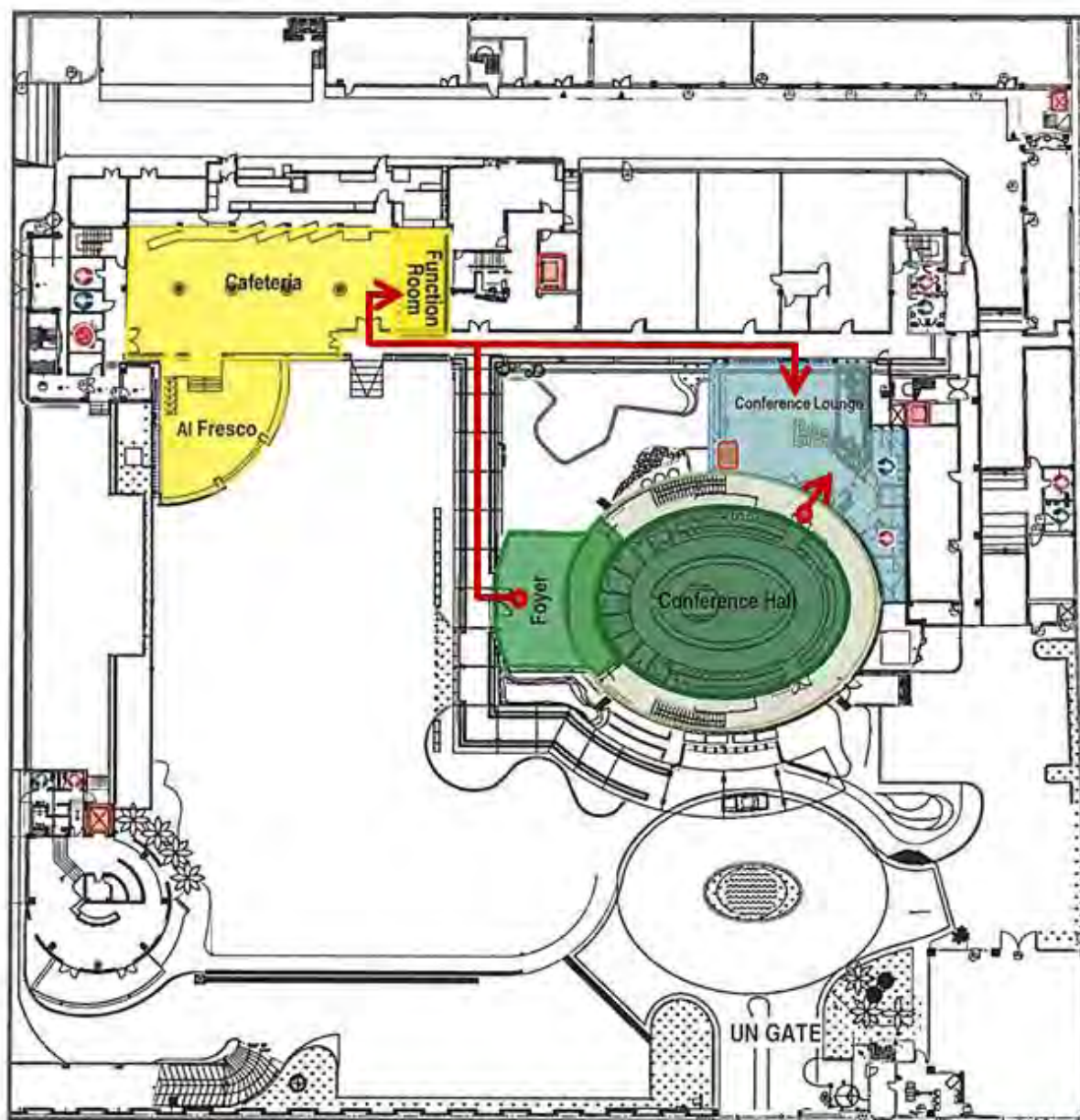

Ground Floor Plan

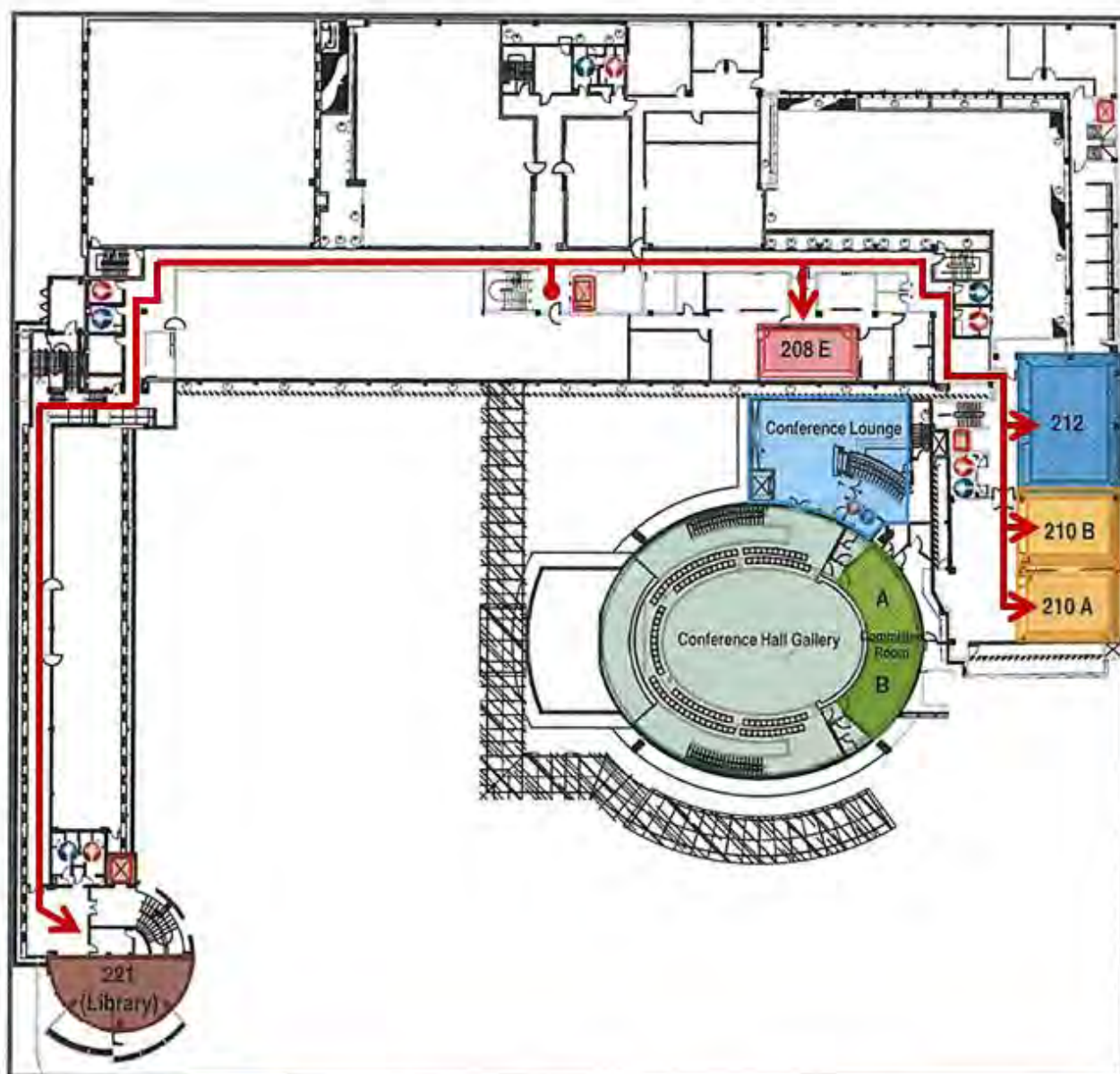

Second Floor Plan

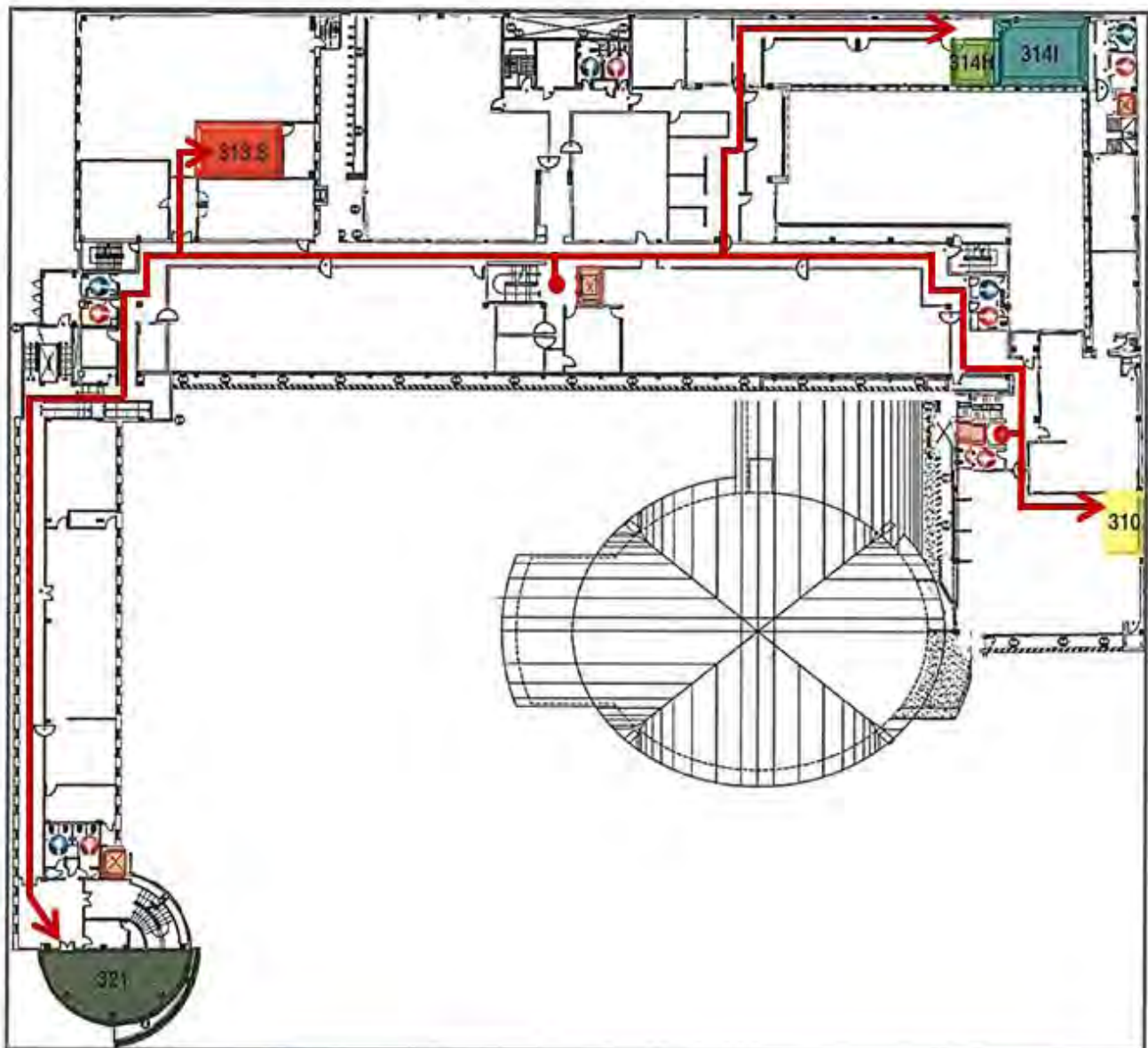

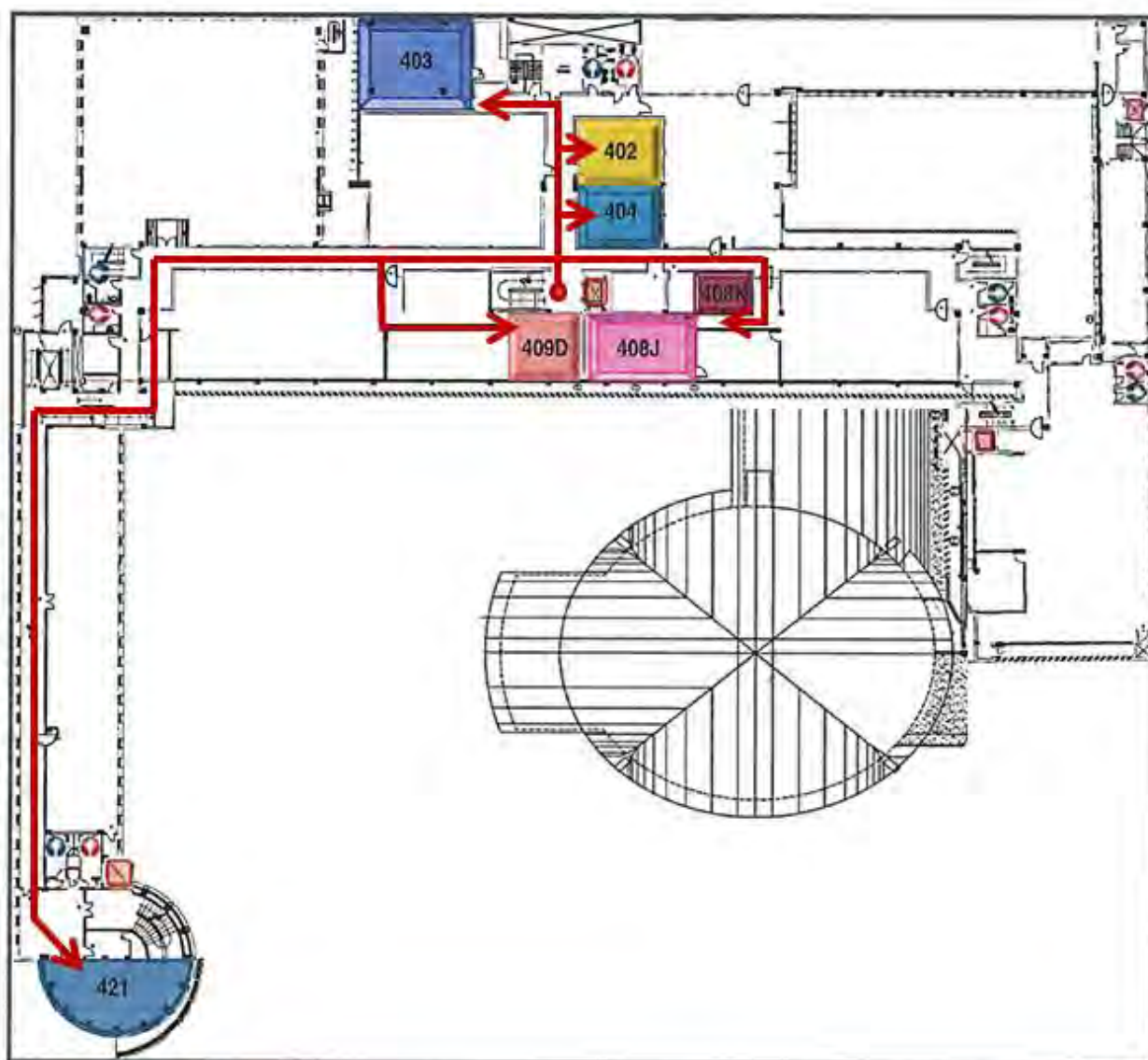
