- University of Medicine and Pharmacy HCMC the largest and highly competitive
  university for health professionals in the southern Vietnam established in 1947;
  comprises with schools of fundamental sciences, medicine, pharmacy, traditional
  medicine, public health, nursing and medical technology, and odonto-stomatology.

- A district health centre in district 1 a public health center facility providing both preventive services and clinical services to people in district 1 of Ho Chi Minh City with about 200,000 population; (maximum 15 participants)
- A commune health centre in Co Giang Ward of district 1 a public primary health care facility located in a ward (Co Giang Ward with about 20,000 population) of urban district (district 1) in Ho Chi Minh City health system (maximum 15 participants)
- **Social Security Office HCMC**; administers pension, social welfare, and social health insurance, of HCM city (maximum 25 participants)




