

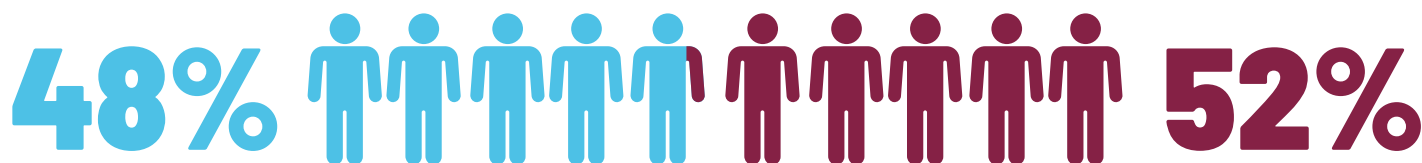

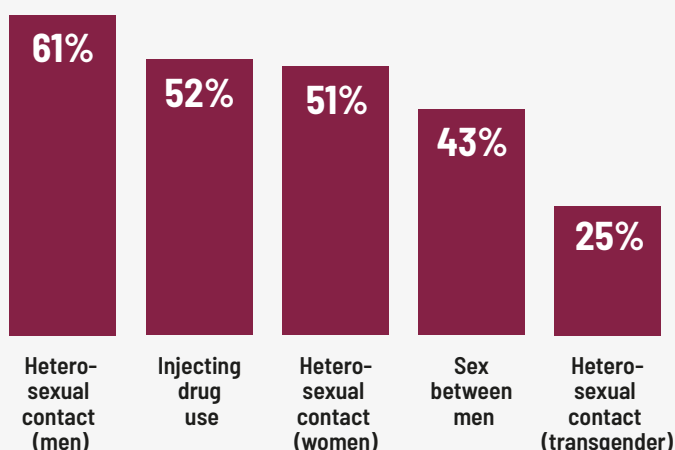

LATE DIAGNOSIS

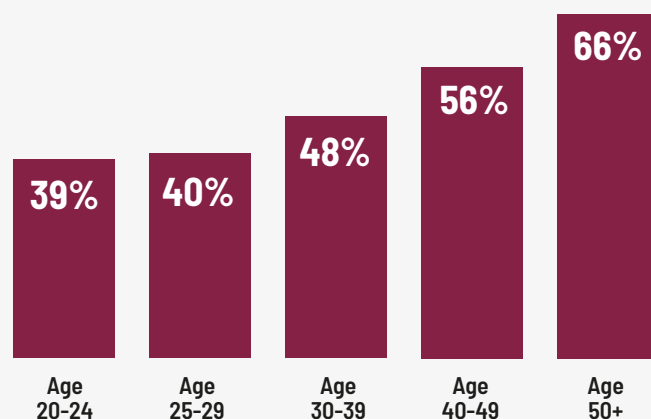
delays treatment and increases

Percentage of people **diagnosed late** with HIV increases with age and is highest in people over age 50.
